Some things to note:

- There are 6 classes in this series, and you have to register for each one separately.
 Registration will close 2 hours before each class. All times are Eastern.
- The page that lists all of the classes defaults to "Date Posted". If you sort by "Start Date", you can get a list of all six classes in order.
- When you click the "Register" button, you will come to a page that says the class cost is \$10.00. This will be waived later on in the registration process for AOS members. AOS members can register for these classes for free as part of your membership benefits.
- You will have to create an account with the PSU Extension group to register; however, you can use your Facebook, Google, or Twitter accounts to sign up.
- At the "Identity Confirmation" page, there is a drop down menu for "Registration Type". Click this and click

on the "American Orchid Society Member". This is the designation that gets AOS members their free registration.

• Everything else from this point on is pretty straight forward.

Letter from the Vice President:

The second half of October was a great time to work in the garden and allow the last of the orchids still out, to enjoy the unusually warm weather. This all changes with the start of November. Temperatures take a dive and all our plants should be inside. Orchid wise, part of our caring will become easier, now that they are all together. On the other hand, we need to keep an eye on insects that may hide deep in the leaf folds. Even after treatment, some insects may linger and 'the kill' is not instant when using a systemic. Being inside, closer together, constant temperatures all provide the right conditions for insects to flourish! Be vigilant and treat appropriately.

The Central Ohio Orchid Show was the last of the shows for 2023. A brief review of how KOS did at

the different shows this year and a look at next year's show schedule!

These last two months of the year will be busy, the slate of newly selected/elected officers will be announced, our November program (8th) being an introduction to the use of clay beads as growing medium (hands-on, instructor Pam LaRocco) with the 'potting' of our project plant in containers and clay beads (LECA meaning lightweight expanded clay aggregate) provided by the society. We end the year with our yearly Christmas dinner on the 13th of December and the installation of the new officers. At this meeting we will discuss some of the programs for 2024.

EDUCATION: Leca, Preparation for Use

Leca must go through at least 2 soaks to be fully effective. Some would say more. Why?

- Leca needs to be rinsed and washed to remove residual chemicals used to enhance the firing process in its production
- It must be fully wet from the interior to the exterior of each ball to effectively wick water from the reservoir at the bottom of your pot to the pellets at the top

Preparation Steps:

- 1. Rinse and drain your Leca to remove all the powdery substance that clings to it
- 2. Soak in the best quality water available to you for ½ hour or longer. Pour off and drain. (Many people suggest repeating this process multiple times)
- 3. Cover the pellet to be used completely with the purest water available to you (Suggestions: Reverse Osmosis, rain, or distilled water). If the best you can use is city water, use it. Add 1 tsp of magnesium sulphate (Epson Salts) and 1 tsp of Calcium Nitrate per gallon of water used. Another optional additive is Dyna-Gro/Superthrive K-L-N rooting hormone at the rate of 1 to 2 tsp per gallon of water. Soak overnight (minimum), preferably for 24 hrs.
- 4. Drain. Rinse well. Use while still wet.
